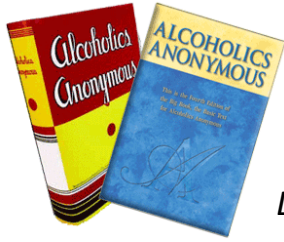

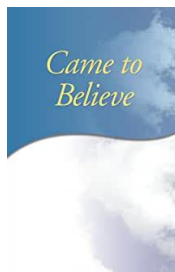


Big Book

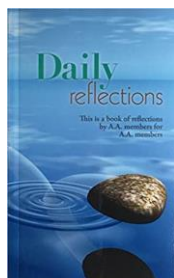
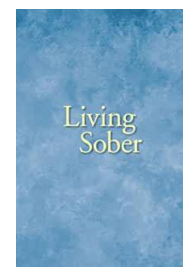


Came to Believe...

Some methods used for living without drinking. Large print & regular print versions are available at Central Office.

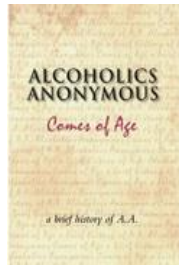

Contains 26 stories by A.A. members who found their way to the Fellowship and got sober while in prison. For those engaged in corrections work. Suitable to give to inmates.

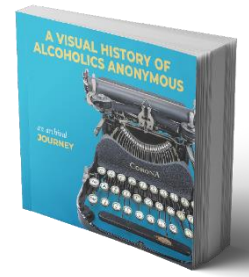
Experience, Strength & Hope
